
Introduction

In 2014, Edmonton Community Foundation (ECF) granted almost \$16.8 million (up from \$12.3 million in 2013 and a record level of granting) to more than 500 registered charities and 220 students, primarily in the Edmonton area. Since its inception in 1989, ECF has granted nearly \$150 million! These grants were primarily made from income from permanently endowed funds and were made possible by the generosity of donors, past and present.

Being an effective grant maker goes beyond cutting a cheque. ECF's role in the community includes acting as a sounding board for community agencies, collaborating with other funders, being a convenor and catalyst for change, and being a source of information about the charitable sector to our donors and others.

ECF was pleased to implement two new granting programs in 2014: 25th Anniversary Grants (page 2) and Vital Signs Grants for Food Security (page 15). ECF was also pleased to implement a successful campaign to establish a new endowment fund to support our Young Edmonton Grants (YEG) Program in perpetuity.

The Community Grants Program is ECF's 'one-stop shop' for charities serving the Edmonton area. Through its Community Grants Program, ECF supports requests from charities involved in arts, culture and heritage; education and learning; community and social services; health and wellness; recreation and leisure; and the environment.

Community Grants are funded from the income of our Community and Field of Interest Funds; donors to these funds have given ECF discretion over allocation of fund income. Support is also provided through the Community Investment Partnership, through which ECF donors provide support to particular projects from donor advised funds or flow-through gifts.
