- Picture of your MNA Citizenship Card or Certificate
- Picture of your Alberta Métis Settlement Membership card

• If you do not have one of these options, you can submit a letter from the MNA or Métis Settlements of Alberta saying that you have applied for membership

If you are approved for an award, your citizenship or membership will need to be confirmed before the award can be finalized.

- Intend to pursue post-secondary education; leading to a degree, diploma, certificate or license (enrolment confirmation not required to apply by March 31)
- Be an Alberta resident

Award Information:

- Along with the completed online application students will be required to upload:
- Proof of Métis Identity
- One reference form is required and one optional
- A copy of most recent transcripts
- Awards candidates will be advised of conditional awards by email in early July of each year

Northern Alberta Development Council (NADC) First Nation, Métis and Inuit (FMNI) Bursary Open June 1 and November 15

The First Nations, Métis and Inuit (FNMI) NADC Bursary is a return service bursary of varying amounts. Students in preapprenticeship training, or in a certificate or diploma studies can access up to \$6,000 for their studies. Students in a Bachelor's, Masters' or PhD program can access \$10,000 per year for any year of their studies.

Applications for the 2023-2024 academic years will open in early February 2023.

Indigenous Graduate Award, Contact your school for application deadlines

The Alberta Graduate Excellence Scholarship recognizes outstanding academic achievement of students pursuing graduate studies in Alberta. It was established to incent the best and the brightest students, including international students, to study in Alberta.

Students must be enrolled in a master's or doctoral degree program approved by the Minister of Advanced Education at one of the following post-secondary schools:

The Government of Alberta offers the Indigenous Graduate Award to encourage Indigenous (First Nations, Métis and Inuit) Albertans to pursue graduate studies in Alberta. All department fields are eligible for funding.

Canada Student grants

Until the end of the 2022 to 2023 school year, you could receive up to \$6,000 per year or up to \$750 per month of study. You can get this grant for each year of your undergraduate studies as long as you are still in school full-time. The school year runs from August 1 to July 31.
